## UNITED WAY SERVICES INCREASES FUNDING TO VGS

For the first time, the United Way Services of Greater Cleveland instituted a Request for Proposal process that specifies the strategies UWS will fund and bring about positive outcomes for various groups of service customers. The agency will donate \$20.6 million to 126 local agencies, including Vocational Guidance Services. About half of the agencies will receive more money under the new system and 21 agencies will receive money for the first time. UWS looked at Greater Cleveland's greatest needs in terms of services provided to people in need.

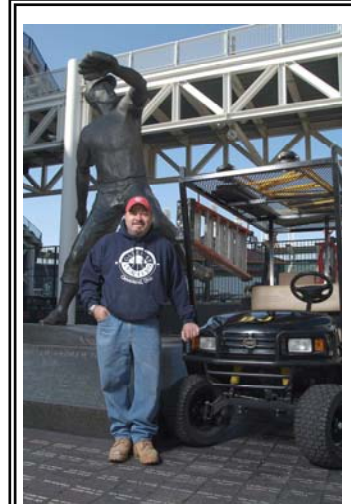
